The report covers the period between April to June 2022, a period of 3 months, this was a period in which our supported youth received school materials, school fees plus blankets due to the cold weather that normally starts in May till July

CHIRADZULU

I visited this centre to distribute the school materials, but also giving those in secondary school fees, and blankets. The supervisor was also given her allowance as per approved requests. The kids were happy and as usual they promised to work hard in class. The supervisor informed me that, she was glad to get her allowance as that will help her to make some ends meet.

It should be noted that come next year, at this centre we will be having only 2 beneficiaries, as such the president advised me that, we will be just sending the support as we are doing in Mulanje. This aspect of sending the monies will begin this term.

MULANJE

As usual I sent the monies to the guardians in Mulanje for the 3 kids available there; they assured me that the money will be put into good use as per the approved requests. After some days the kids called me to notify that they received the monies and they have purchased the blankets. They appreciated a lot and promise to work hard in their schools.

Still more, in Mulanje in the coming academic year, we will have only one student on our support list.

JALI

I visited this centre with the Chairman to distribute the school materials plus blankets. The committee members and kids were very much happy to receive the materials. They assured the chairman that, with the support given, they will continue working extra hard at school so that, the support shouldn't go in vain.

On his part the chairman, encouraged the kids to work hard but also exercise discipline in their homes so that, parents should not be bothered by them.

The committee promised us that they will continue monitoring the kids so that, their goals must be achieved. They further assured the chairman that, regardless of what circumstances they may have, but the kids will continue to be supported.

They finally promised that they will continue taking care of the maize mill plus the buildings.

PRESIDENT VISIT /NEW SITE

We were privileged to receive the president in Malawi. Among the activities he did was to visit Jali centre and distribute extra materials such as sugar and soap to the kids. He also met the committee members who appreciated him for his visit to Jali centre after a long time. Of course the committee being new was motivated and encouraged by his sound advice, he advised them to continue taking care of the maize mill as well as supervising the kids in the area.

The members assured the president that, it was their responsibility to do as required but also giving reports to the coordinator on how the maize mill was being run. They thanked him for the loan they got.

NEW SITE

Apart from the president visiting and giving the kids at Jali some groceries, he also visited the building which is on sale for another mill in Pirititi area almost 5km from where we have the existing maize mill. The owner is selling the building with already twin ESCOM power cables plus another house and a toilet. The building is costing K5,000,000.00. After further discussions, the president requested him to reduce to K3,000,000.00 but the owner refused. Of course at a later date he called me, that, the building plus everything can be sold at K4,000,000.00 only.

But later the president, made an offer of K3,500,000.00 in which the seller finally agreed. As such the site and all its structures have been pegged at the mentioned price.

Of course looking at the site though close to another maize mill, but the price is fair, this is because the building has already a 3 phase wire connection, symbolizes that, it's close to the transformer, honestly its difficult here in Malawi to get such structures at such price.

The place is close to the tarmac road and will be a good place for business, especially that the purpose is to help the kids within the area.

FRANK MATUTO

Frank Matuto will be sitting for his JC exams, in August 2022, so upon communicating with him through the teacher at his school, I just encouraged him to be working extra hard so that, his goals should to be achieved. He thanked GEAMOC for the support, he is getting and he promised to continue working extra hard.

LIRANGWE

I visited this centre to give them the required materials such as school fees, blankets, and school materials. All the students we have at this centre are in Form 4, as such in the next academic year, we won't have any student at this centre. Unless others are selected to go to university then, when funds will be available, they will be supported. As previously reported, guardians are still worried that, GEAMOC will be phasing out, in Lirangwe, which for a long time, they didn't expect that, it will happen.

The students thanked the GEAMOC for the support rendered to them and they still promised to work hard to emulate Enock Banda, who is at Mzuzu University.

ENOCK BANDA

Enock Banda is currently at college and is still appreciating the support the organization is giving him. He promised to share his experience with our current kids when he comes back during holidays.

REMARKS

Students have opened their last term of this academic year on 20th June 2022, as such we need to pay their school fees. Since the year has been divided onto 4 terms as we are reverting to the old system, and that we already gave the kids some materials recently, the president advised me that, we should just pay the school fees, while school materials and all the necessities will be given to them in the new academic year in September. Hence having a small request list.

As per our financial cash-flow and bank statement, we don't have enough money in our accounts to fulfill the activities as outlined in the request lists; hence we request the treasure for consideration.
